Edinburgh 2010 volunteers will be at Edinburgh airport on Tuesday 1 and Wednesday 2 June to greet delegates. Look out for welcomers wearing tartan sashes and carrying an Edinburgh 2010 sign. They will direct you to the coach for travel to Pollock Halls.

Report to Pollock Halls Reception Centre on arrival to check-in to your room and collect your keys. The reception is open 24 hours. Check-in time is after 14:00 and check-out time is 10:30. Phone: +44 (0)131 651 2001

Registration for the conference will be in the John McIntyre Conference Centre (JMCC) from 14:15 until 18:00 on Wednesday 2nd June. The registration desk will be open throughout the conference.



Accommodation

If you have booked accommodation through the conference organisers, the accommodation is at Pollock Halls (see arrival). If you have any queries about your accommodation, please contact Amy Middlemass at amy.middlemass@ed.ac.uk. Unless you have requested extra (or fewer) nights, the rooms are booked from 2-6 June inclusive.

Please note: accommodation in Edinburgh in early June is already heavily booked.

Campus Facilities

Wi-fi access will be available free in the JMCC. Access from bedrooms may be purchased from the reception centre at the delegate's own expense.

There is a cash point, basic shop, coffee area and bar within the JMCC.

Pollock Halls menus cater for a variety of dietary options.

Smoking is strictly prohibited on the University of Edinburgh campus.

Conference Refunds Policy

Your conference fee covers accommodation and full board at Pollock Halls; coach on arrival and departure; coaches to and from the reception in the Scottish Parliament on Thursday 3; coaches from the Assembly Hall to Pollock Halls on Sunday 6. All other expenses are the responsibility of the individual delegate or their sending organisation, e.g. other meals, travel or accommodation and incidentals. Any other previously agreed refunds (e.g. conference fees or travel) will be made by bank transfer after the conference.



Travelling Companions

Some delegates are travelling with a companion. The conference organisers will not be able to provide accommodation etc for unregistered arrivals. Travelling companions will not be allowed into the conference sessions. Tickets for guest meals can be bought at reception.

Translation

A 'whispering' translation service in English-French and English-Spanish will be provided in the main conference hall. Headsets will be available at the back of the hall.

National Dress

You may wish to bring national dress, especially for the Opening and Closing Ceremonies and the Parliamentary Reception.

Bring a Stone from Home

You are asked to bring a pebble-sized stone from where you live. It will be used in the Opening Ceremony. At the Closing Ceremony, you will receive a similar stone from the Island of Iona to take home with you. Iona is one of the cradles of Christianity in Scotland, with a monastic history dating back to the 7th century.



Reception at the Scottish Parliament

There will be a reception for conference delegates at the Scottish Parliament on the evening of Thursday 3 June. The number of places is strictly limited. Admission is restricted to official conference delegates and named special guests. Delegates' travelling companions will not be admitted unless this has been arranged with the Conference Office beforehand. You will require your conference delegate badge and proof of identity as part of the security procedures on arrival. This includes an airport style check.
