In 1910 Edinburgh became host to over 1,200 mainly Protestant Christians from across the English-speaking world, gathering together to think strategically about the worldwide mission of the Christian Church. In a rapidly changing social, economic and religious global environment, Church leaders and mission societies from across the Western world gathered in recognition that Christian mission in the new century would require a much greater unity of purpose, vision and responsibility. God's Church would need to be drawn together by a common purpose to reach every corner of the world with the love of Christ.



Churches in Britain and Ireland invite the Christian family to remember the 1910 World Missionary Conference; to reflect on how Mission has changed in the last 100 years; and, to be inspired for Mission in the 21st century.

The International Missionary Conference was a hugely historic event – an extraordinary spectacle – which helped to start the modern ecumenical movement.

In 2010 the global church shall come together in a variety of different countries, churches, denominations and groups to celebrate together what God has done through his missional Church and celebrate all that God will do in the future.
